The Trust is celebrating a decade of OST partnerships with a number of events this spring that celebrate our young people. We are hosting a **Read-a-thon** to promote the enjoyment and rewards that young people gain from reading books, and the importance of literacy building activities during the summer months. Please join us **Tuesday, May 12th 5:00—7:00 p.m.** at the **Washington Highlands Neighborhood Library**, located at **115 Atlantic Street, SW**, as we kick-off this fun contest that highlights our partnership with DC Public Library and the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE).

Read-a-thon Requirements:

- Students will read books (in their entirety) listed from on the age-appropriate lists (ages 6-8, 9-11, or 12-14) from May 12th – June 12th.
- Parent, guardian, site director or program coordinator (adult) will monitor and sign off-on “book log” to verify that the student has completed reading the book.
 - Adult signature and page count for each book must be logged on the book log.
- Winners will be announced and awarded prize at our evening anniversary celebration Tuesday, June 23rd at WVSA, 1100 16th Street, NW from 6 – 8:00 pm.

Contest Eligibility

- Students ages 6 – 14 are eligible to compete.
- Book log submissions must be verified by an adult, and accurately reflect the books read by the student.
- If there is a tie for the most books read in each age group, winners will be randomly selected from eligible entrants that have read the most books.

Awards

Top readers in each age range will be recognized at the June 23rd Evening Celebration and receive gift certificates.

- 1st place winner will receive \$100 gift certificate.
- 2nd place winner will receive \$75 gift certificate.
- 3rd place winner will receive \$50 gift certificate.
